THE LENTEN JOURNEY BEGINS THIS WEEK.

Our journey together through Lent begins with two very small words:

Prayer

Resolve this Lent to pray more. Avoid telling yourself there is no time for prayer. Be inventive. As you get ready for the day, in the shower, on your way to work, during lunch on your way home, while preparing dinner – there are always a few moments for prayer. Lenten devotions every Wednesday evening are meditations extended over 14 reflections on Lenten themes set against the back drop of moments in Jesus’ suffering and death. Your daily meditation booklet will assist in your prayer with brief Lenten meditations for each day in the coming seven weeks.

Fasting

Resolve this Lent to fast. Start your fasting with small things: no meat eaten on Wednesdays and Fridays: no jam on your toast, no soft drink for lunch, no afternoon snack, no dessert with dinner on selected days of your choosing or on everyday of the season of Lent.

Fasting has been called “the prayer of the body.” When we consciously deny ourselves some small pleasure, we almost automatically become more attentive to things that really matter – like our relationship with God.

Almsgiving

Resolve this Lent to remember the needy. We think of fasting as giving something *up*. Think of almsgiving (or charity toward the poor) as giving something *back*. Designate your snack money for a charity that mails a solicitation to your home. Giving of our time is equally valuable. Volunteering at a soup kitchen or a homeless shelter will make us more aware of the needs of the poor and build solidarity with them.

There will be days when our best intentions fall short. But acknowledging our failures and moving on is also a part of this holy season. With God's help, our Lenten resolutions could become life long habits.

Some of the Things We Need and some of the Things that Need to be Attended to later in the season during Lent, during Holy Week and for Easter:

What Can You Do This Year?

How Could You be Helpful?

- lectors for Ash Wednesday and Easter Sunday
- lectors for new stations of the cross format
- crucifer(s) for weekly stations of the cross and for procession of Easter Sunday
- palm cutter
- palm trimmers
- readers of the Lord's Passion for Palm Sunday
- audio technician for Good Friday Tenebre service sound effects
(job description: turn on/turn off power button of sound system at appointed time)
- acolytes for our Lenten and Easter observances
- egg colorers for Easter Sunday Swieconka blessed on Holy Saturday with all the traditional Easter foodstuffs: eggs and dye kits will be provided. These supplies can be delivered to you and picked up from you as needed.

- Easter floral memorials:

Catastrophic Plumbing!

A major problem has befallen our plumbing system. The pipes that run through the concrete slab under the church have broken and have caused flooding in the area at the Blessed Virgin altar on the left side.

The problem has been only partially contained as we seek the best solution to it. The plan currently is to reroute the plumbing in such a way as to eliminate the use of the deteriorating pipes under the church within the concrete slab. There are two possibilities to accomplish this goal which avoids the prospect of this problem happening again within that same pipe work system but in another location within the slab.

The flooring in the church will have to be broken into with either plan though the plans differ as to (1) running new lines above the slab in the church or (2) running new lines buried alongside the exterior of the church in order to connect with the rectory plumbing system.

Our water bill for the previous month was \$750. As the problem has been partially contained by a series of valves, the next bill will not be so high. Costs are currently being prepared for both the exterior placement of the lines and the alternate plan for lines running on the floor inside the church worship area.

Please be as generous as you can in assisting with the funding of the repair once costs are fully determined.
